President General Address

Dear Compatriots

FUND RAISING AND REMEMBRANCE DAY OF THE 7TH OF OCTOBER MASSACRE:

We are gathered here once again to remember the calamity that was visited on this town on the 7th day of October, 1967. October 7th is a day to be observed with solemnity and introspection. The new Executive Council of the Asaba Development Union that assumed office recently, decided to construct a cenotaph or Monument in Ogbeosowa village in memory of these compatriots senselessly massacred by Federal troops in Asaba on that day.

THE MONUMENT:

This monument is a symbol of the sacrifice of Asaba in the unity of Nigeria. The N.E.C. feels we need a place to remind us of their sacrifices and contemplate our losses, a place to immortalize our fathers, uncles, brothers, sisters, aunts, cousins and nephews who were senselessly murdered by Federal troops on that unforgettable day. When completed it will bear the names of victims from the five villages of the town (ebos).

COMMEMORATION OF THE EVENT:

The 7th of October, 1967 will ever be remembered as <u>BLOODY 7TH OCTOBER</u> and a <u>day of INFAMY</u>. The 7th of October should be a day for us to contemplate our losses; a day in which wives buried their husbands, mothers buried their children especially male children who were separated from others and then shot. This selective killing of male children shows premeditation and was aimed at ensuring the elimination and extermination of the productive section of our people. The net result is the loss of a whole generation of our sons. It was an unhappy event that should be commemorated annually, a <u>day when a peace-loving and accommodating people</u>, a <u>people with a world-wide view</u>, <u>resplendent in their usual traditional white dresses trouped out with dances in a procession to welcome the Federal troops only to be decimated by the same troops.</u>

DONATIONS FOR THE COMPLETION OF THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE MONUMENT:

The construction is in an advanced stage. All we need to do now is to give befitting finishing touches to the monument. When the contract was awarded in 2010 the cost was=N=1,982,125:00. (One Million, Nine Hundred and Eighty Two Thousand, One Hundred and Twenty-five Naira Only). This did not include the perimeter wall and landscaping of the surroundings. With the additional cost of work on the perimeter and the surroundings the total cost of the project has now risen to =N=3,588,655;00 (Three million, Five Hundred and Eighty-Eight Thousand, Six Hundred and Fifty-Five Naira Only).

Till date we have received donations totaling =N=900,000:00 (Nine Hundred Thousand Naira Only) from six donors.

This leaves us with a deficit of =N=2,688,655:00. The donors will be sent acknowledgments and statement of expenditure.

<u>VISITING PROFESSORS FROM UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN FLORIDA:</u>

May I take this opportunity to thank the two professors from the United states- Professor Liz Bird and Professor Frazer Ottanelli - specifically from the University of Southern Florida have been intimately involved in the work of bringing this event to the world. They have visited the country on several occasions to gather materials and interview survivors and eye-witnesses.

His Royal Majesty has graciously agreed that their works be exhibited in the palace museum. We still have to complete the monument.

THE OCTOBER 7, 1967 MASSACRE OF ASABA PEOPLE: WHY?

Before Nigeria's Independence on October 1st, 1960, the name Asaba was already known world-wide through the activities of early European merchants followed later by those of Christian missionaries. These two European groups found the people of Asaba very friendly and the weather very tolerable and convenient.

They made Asaba the base of their activities west of the River Niger. Asaba people, in turn, took advantage of this early contact with Europeans to send their children to school and learnt the white man's language and culture. The consequence of this early start was that Asaba produced the pool from which educated personnel could be drawn not only to act as interpreters to the white man as he ventured into the hinter lands from Asaba but also as clerks, teachers and catechists. These people who carried the name of Asaba and different communities they went to serve were happy to associate themselves with Asaba.

The first generation of educated Asaba people ensured that their own children were better educated as many of such children were sent to school overseas where they specialized in different fields of learning. Thus by 1960, the Asaba man was found not only in different fields and positions but also at the apex. As attestation to this position, Hon. Justice R.A.I. Ogbobine writing in 1982 about Asaba had this to say, inter alia

"It is doubtful whether there is any other community in Bendel State whenever there are most highly educated people in different spheres of learning and discipline than in Asaba".

The above statement attracted envy which in time conceived and gave birth to concealed hatred which could not be opened demonstrated to the Asaba man.

One of the second generation of educated Asaba sons was Chief Dennis .C. Osadebay who left his law firm to join the pre and post Nigeria's independence politics. He occupied various political positions and crowned it with becoming the rallying point for the struggle for the creation of the fourth region in Nigeria, the Midwest Region carved out of the West Region- and becoming that Region's first Premier (now Governor). He thus helped in 'enlarging the coast' of Asaba. The new region had fourteen divisions and Asaba was one of such divisions. Virtually all the people in Asaba Division were simply identified as Asaba people. Roughly, Asaba Division comprised of the present north and south of both Aniocha and Oshimili local government areas as Delta State of today. Thus, irrespective of which town or village a person came from, from the old Asaba Division, he was simply identified and tagged as an Asaba man. He was proud to be so identified.

In January 1966, Nigeria's first Military coup took place. The coup leader, Major Chukwuma Kaduna Nzeogwu, though from Okpanam in the present Oshimili North local government, was widely reported to hail from Asaba. As it turned out, Chief Dennis .C. Osadebay was spared while some political leaders from non-Ibo speaking areas were killed during the coup. This co-incidence was seen as Asaba man, Nzeogwu, shielding another Asaba man, Osadebay!!

At the outbreak of the civil war, the federal authorities placed embargo against Biafra and subsequently closed down movement on the Niger Bridge Linking Asaba to Onitsha. Before then the Nigeria armed forces had broken up such that officers and men were sent to their regions of origin. The crop of top military officers that returned to the Midwest was of western Ibo extraction, mainly from Asaba Division and by extension, from Asaba. But the Biafra army, on 9th August, 1967 invaded the Midwest from across the Niger Bridge that was supposed to have been closed and manned by the Nigeria soldiers.

The federal authorities took it that the action of the Biafra soldiers was aided by the 'Asaba' top military officers. It was counted against Asaba. The truth, however, was that Asaba did not have any top officer in the army as the town believed that a mother who had 'a soldier son was childless'. They loathed violence.

Then came the struggle by the federal authorities to liberate the Midwest. As events later proved, Asaba was a choice target as its liberation would launch the federal troops into Biafra. It was all 'when we reach Asaba' by the federal soldiers.

The federal soldiers eventually got to Asaba in the night of 6th October, 1967 but their hope of rolling into Onitsha across the Niger Bridge was thwarted by the retreating Biafran soldiers who had earlier that evening blown off the Onitsha tail span of that Bridge with the bitter hatred nursed against 'Asaba by the federal authorities for various crimes' purportedly carried out by people claiming to be Asaba people. They went on rampage throughout that night mauling down the defenseless Asaba citizens.

Then came the 7th of October, 1967, when the soldiers went on rampage, ran berserk with the sole aim of fishing out Asaba people. Men were separated from women and eventually, one of the world known genocides was carried out on them (Asaba men) in different locations of the town, notably at OGBEOSOWA.

Conclusion

Due to non recognition of the perceived genocide committed by the federal troops at that time and no reparation paid to the affected victims of Asaba community, the Asaba Development Union in its wisdom now deems it proper to bring the incident to the public as well as commemorating October 7, every year as Memorial Day for the repose of the souls of the 1967 war victims.
